CHE'S PLACE!

"For God, who said, "Let there be light in the darkness," has made this light shine in our hearts so we could know the glory of God that is seen in the face of Jesus Christ."

In May 2016, two young people from Bolton were murdered at Wasaga beach. As a community we remembered the LORD's promise in 2 Corinthians 4:6. A large group of young people and adults have joined together to help bring light out of darkness in memory of Francesco Molinaro - affectionately known to friends as "Che." What has resulted is the creation of **Che's Place!**

Che's Place is a charitable youth centre originated and operated by a community Board and adult and youth sub-committees. Our mission is

to unite youth from all walks of life and to host a safe and welcoming place for them to spend time and grow and develop healthy relationships. The environment will be positive and fun which will allow them to express themselves in a comfortable setting.

Many young people feel they have no place in town to spend time and have resorted to parking lots, parks and back alley's. Together with the Caledon OPP and local schools we will be mentoring the youth and teaching them skills to adapt for their future and providing resources where needed.

Our Mission Statement reads - *"At Che's Place we encourage our youth to develop confidence and self-esteem, enabling them to face the future with a positive outlook. Che's is their place to call home, welcoming all with care and respect. Having our youth leading and participating in community events and issues will give them opportunities and experience in working with others, help them to voice their opinions, and allow them to develop friendships and contacts that will last a lifetime."*

An African proverb says - "It takes a village to raise a child" and Nashville Road Community Church is part of the "village" that our children and young people need. Please pray for the young people, parents and leaders who are working to bring Che's Place to life mid-November and for the opportunities the church may have to bring love and light to the lives of all who are part of Che's Place! **For more information and for how to get involved - please speak to Marisa Parise or Andrea Wilson**

SUNDAY MORNING GATHERING:



Have you ever run out of gas? Last year AAA reported that it received 600,000 calls for assistance due to cars running out of gas. When the fuel light comes on, how many of us view that as a challenge to see how much farther we can make it before refueling?! It's less of a gamble if you understand your cars' fuel efficiency, which is the ratio of distance traveled per unit of fuel consumed. In humans - we could talk about endurance. What's your "endurance efficiency" when it comes to life? Paul's encouragement to the church from prison is an example of his ability to endure and rise above his circumstances. What fueled him? What did he pray would fuel the Christians at Ephesus? This Sunday we'll worship together around Ephesians 1:15-23, catching Paul's practical encouragement to use that fuel and see reality, ourselves and the future as God see's them!

We're saying we need each other as we live the Christian life on Jesus' mission.
